PASTOR DAN GERRIETTS SENIOR PASTOR I am about to do a new thing. Now it springs forth! Do you not perceive it? – Isaiah 43:19

For many of us, 2022 arrived with a mixture of weariness and hope. Weariness that we must start yet another year under the cloud of the pandemic and its challenges. But also hope – that life going forward is going to be significantly better, and that we will continue to regain a sense of safety and freedom and connection to each other.

It is good to hope. For we belong to a God who relishes hope and the chance to create new life, especially when no one is looking for it. Like in the midst of Israel's slavery in Egypt. Or when Judah was scattered in exile. Or in the tomb where Jesus' body lay. Across the ages, God has continually done new things that both surprise and delight those caught in weary, desperate situations, or who feel caught in the winds of change.

Each January, we pause at Trinity to look back at God's new life work and to prayerfully imagine where God is leading us in the coming year. 2021 was another year of unexpected joys and new beginnings for TLC – perhaps more so than any year in recent history:

- It was our first full year of online and hybrid ministries as an intentional strategy to expand our community of worship, learning, care and connection beyond in-person gatherings. While we still deeply value the importance of inperson gatherings, we have seen how God's healing love can reach hundreds of new people through these technologies, and even help them put down roots in our congregation.
- Despite the pandemic, we marked our 150th Anniversary with joyous gatherings, beautiful worship, fantastic meals and two successful mission projects with Habitat and ELCA World Hunger. It was a celebration worthy of Trinity's Servant Church legacy.

- Six new staff joined our team as we both adapted and added staff roles for a changing ministry. We said goodbye to Pastor Kevin Jones as he began his new call as our Bishop. And we began interviewing for our next associate pastor. We hope to have a candidate to present for congregational approval very soon.
- With the resumption of in-person activities last January, we were finally able to utilize our newly renovated building. What fun it has been to watch our congregation and wider community using these spaces, and to see how they have grown our ability to serve, connect and gather.

What new thing will God do in 2022? Trinity's leadership is exploring how our congregation might serve as an "anchor" for those churches in our region who seek revitalization or are unable to call pastoral leadership. We will keep serving the spiritual, emotional and physical needs of our community. And in light of our rapidly changing world, we will continue to draw on our past, keep faith in the present, and trust in God's future for us.

God has done remarkable things with and through us this past year. And Trinity's mission is vibrant and growing in a really challenging time for all churches. Thank you for taking part in this mission. And thank you for your trust in our God who makes all things new – our hope and our life!
