

ALWAYS RISING - A LETTER FROM PASTOR DAN GERRIETTS

n a recent Sunday our congregation sang the hymn, "The Church of Christ, in Every Age" (ELW 729). The opening line says, "The church of Christ, in every age beset by change, but Spiritled, must claim and test its heritage and keep on rising from the dead."

I kept glancing back at the first stanza as we sang the remaining four, wondering if that last part was quite right. "The church must...keep rising from the dead?" It struck me as extreme. Yes, the church is always changing. Yes, we claim and test our heritage, following the Spirit. But rising from the dead? Don't be so dramatic, dear hymn. The church hasn't died since it started, shortly after Jesus' own rising. Right?

Maybe. For years, historians have argued there is an every-500-year trend in Christianity whereby a new and more vital form of religion emerges. It happened around the Reformation. And it happened 500 years before that, and 500 years before that. In each case, some long-held ways of being church died. New forms of faith rose up. And in between each major shift, Christianity rebirthed itself in countless smaller ways as particular practices, structures and even theologies shifted.

For instance, did you know that part of the adult baptismal rite in the early church involved slapping the candidate in the face? At some point, the church let that practice die. (Good call.) Other practices were born. The church is always dying and rising. You have to in order to keep following Jesus.

As we celebrate Christ's rising this Easter, I'm reminded how God is bringing new life at Trinity:

- the relaunch of TLC's Care Ministry in February a powerful lay team that is • helping us visit, support and provide home communion for more people than ever
- the new worship/music leadership model where ministries that used to be led by • one person are now shepherded by 10 different people
- the departure of our Youth/Young Adult Director Kristian Carlson (a loss for us!) • but a new beginning for him in his home congregation, and a chance for us to find our next great leader
- the call committee for our Pastor of Spiritual Care receiving some candidates to consider

In Christ, we are always rising. What a promise – for the church, and for each of us. Pastor Dan Gerrietts

CONNECTION CREW



A ssembling and mailing over 400 Connection newsletters requires quite a crew. The last Wednesday morning each month finds a team of volunteers gathered in the Fellowship Hall to label, fold, tape and put the finished newsletter in bins to go to the post office.

Although the Connection newsletter is offered online, so many people still prefer a physical copy. Marge Baack is one of them. "I just love to sit down and read it page to page," she said.

Baack and her husband, Harlan, are two of the volunteers who make sure the newsletter gets into people's hands



each month. Other members of the crew include Eloise Davis. Sharon Heimbuch, Kathy Pitcher, Patty Flatness, Craig Remmen, Mike Last and Criss Moore. Of course, Lou Ann Rossler starts the process. She's been doing this a long time, and remembers when the newsletter went out once a week, even having to be broken down by differ-

ent zip codes before getting mailed. Rossler said she "gives the Connection crew the stuff and they just take off and do it!" She added, "They're just a lovely group of people!"

Why volunteer for this essential task each month? "It's fun!" Moore said. Remmen added, "Because Lou Ann calls and asks!" Marge Baack chimed in, "We're just a one-of-a-kind committee!"

Heimbuch explained that she was passionate about volunteering at the Hawkeye Harvest Food Bank. "Now I am able to do less than I used to," she said, "so I've replaced my work there with this." Although she was sad to give up her work at the Food Bank, she finds helping with the Connection mailing fulfilling as well.

Everyone on this crew volunteers in many other ways, either at Trinity or other locations in town. Kathy Pitcher explained that she and Remmen will be co-chairs of the Scandinavian Bazaar this year. The two laughed when Pitcher said, "We play well together!" Remmen joked, "She does kind of mother me sometimes..." This is the type of conversation you might hear if you're anywhere near this bunch as they're working. Chatting happily and sometimes



stopping for a snack keeps them coming back every month.

Davis explained that she also used to help with mailings at Stebens Children's Theatre after she retired from being a para at the high school for almost 30 years. She shared a secret about working on the Connection crew: Sometimes the crew spots their name and address on a newsletter, but "[It] gives us a first look, we can't take it home!" Davis said. A retired teacher, paras, a print shop expert, a factory worker and a former Lutheran bishop (among other occupations)...all have their own gifts that they bring to the table in getting the Connection out each month. Since Remmen spent 30 years in a printing company and also has a self-confessed fascination for paper, he said, "It reminds me of the work I used to do...but this is more fun!" Patty Flatness said, "I really enjoy helping with the Connection! The group we have going is the best and we keep



track of each other beyond that, too." She added, "[It] Gives us a first look at the upcoming month also!" And retired Bishop Mike Last mentioned that he appreciates the good fellowship involved in assembling the Connection newsletters. "The place buzzes!" he exclaimed, "and I like that!" He also added, "I'm a person who

needs to stay busy. That's why I'm here. To sit at home and twiddle my thumbs...that's not me!" Thanks to this crew for being an important part of "connecting" Trinity members. Verses to Live By MARCH 2024

Starting this month, we will introduce a column focusing on congregation members and their favorite Bible verses. The participant will share a verse that speaks to their heart, as well as their thoughts about how this verse has influenced their life. The pieces will close with a question and a prayer. The first installation of "Verses to Live By" was written by Stu Vold.



STU VOLD

Selecting my favorite Bible verse is easy. Narrowing it down to one is not so easy. In spite of 7 ½ decades of good, smart Sunday School teachers and pastors explaining the meaning of Bible passages, I still find many Biblical messages disconcertingly difficult to understand and sometimes contradictory. That says something about me, I think, and not about the pastors. Thus, my tendency is to lean on verses that simplify the intentions and instructions inherent in Biblical stories.

With that as background and perspective, for many years now I settled on Micah 6:8. It is straightforward and simple: "He has shown you what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly, and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Or, as a friend once summarized this verse-be fair, be kind, be humble. Think of a world where we each lived by those tenets.

I believe acting justly (being fair) and loving mercy (being kind) are somewhat self-explanatory, if not always easy. Walking humbly with my God is a little trickier, for me anyway, because it is open-ended without offering prescriptive behaviors. At a minimum, that "requirement" encourages living a life fueled by FAITH and by GRATITUDE for the blessings that flow from God.

Perhaps no one else thinks this verse is as simply instructive as I find it to be. Even so, ask yourself which one of these requirements (not mere suggestions) you believe to be the most important and/or the most difficult.

Finally, a closing prayer, one which I use each morning, which recognizes the trust we can have in God's consistent generosity:

Thank you, God, for giving me everything that I will need today, and help me to use those gifts to live my life in the way you want me to live it. *Amen.*

CO-ED SOFTBALL RETURNS THIS SUMMER
