

# First Reading: Job 38:1-7, 34-41

L <sup>1</sup>The LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind: 2"Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? <sup>3</sup>Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me. 4"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. <sup>5</sup>Who determined its measurements—surely you know! 


