everything Faith and Service [in] between Sometimes faith is simple. But

sometimes it's messy and nuanced - more complex than black or white, one thing or the other. This Lent, we are letting the Gospel of Luke guide us to the "in-between" nature of following Jesus. Today Jesus comes to the home of Martha and Mary. Hospitality! In many translations, Jesus says that "Mary has chosen the better part," which has been used to create a divide between Mary and Martha. However, in the Greek, Mary has chosen the "good portion," and Martha's tasks are called "ministry." We need the Word. Come Lord Jesus! By faith we serve Jesus in the world.


Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-7, 13: 1-7

L ⁴Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, ⁵ and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, 6 and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

If I speak in the tongues of humans and of angels but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. ² And if I have prophetic powers and understand all mysteries and all knowledge and if I have all faith so as to remove mountains but do not have love, I am nothing. ³ If I give away all my possessions and if I hand over my body so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.


